COMPREHENSIVE FEE

Semester: \$9,950 (Fall or Spring)
Summer Session: \$4,950
Summer Term: \$7,750 (Korea, China & Japan)
Winter Session: \$3,950

Internship during semester is additional \$1,500.

Internship during summer session is additional \$1,000.

PROGRAM DATES

Spring Semester: early March - late June

Summer Term: late June - mid-August

Academic Year combines Fall & Spring semesters, and Winter session (optional). Calendar Year combines Spring & Fall semesters, and Summer session/term (optional).

Summer Term is a multi-country experience combining 4-weeks of courses at Hanyang University in South Korea with 2-weeks of travel, cultural activities and lectures at prestigious universities in China and Japan.

LOCATION

Seoul is the capital of South Korea, and a global hub for business, technology, culture and entertainment. The city is a blend of tradition and modernity offering centuries-old palaces like Gyeongbokgung, serene temples like Bongjeonsa, bustling markets like Myeongdong, and futuristic architecture like in Gangnam. South Korea, officially the Republic of Korea, boasts beautiful natural landscapes with a mix of mountainous regions, coastal areas and islands. With a rich history, diverse culinary scene, and a thriving K-pop culture, Seoul and South Korea promise an unforgettable experience.

Hanyang University (HU) is one of the premier universities in South Korea. Founded in 1939 as the first private engineering school, it has grown into a comprehensive institution known for its strengths in engineering, business, medicine, social sciences, and the arts.

ONSITE SUPPORT

KEI provides support before and during the program. The KEI Onsite Director organizes airport welcome and transportation, a comprehensive orientation, and group activities and field trips intended to enhance cultural understanding and integration, and provides advice, assistance and emergency support.

HOUSING

Students live at the university residence. The residence has study areas, laundry facilities, a gym and a common area with microwaves and refrigerators for heating and storing food (cooking not allowed). Rooms are double-occupancy with en-suite bathrooms. The campus offers a cafeteria that serves Korean and international food. Seoul has many restaurants and cafes.

ACADEMICS

SEMESTER

- ✓ Maximum of 16 credits per semester
- ✓ Most courses are 3 credits; Internships are 6-9 credits
- ✓ *Contemporary Korean Studies* (or similar) required

SUMMER SESSION & TERM

- ✓ Maximum of 9 credits per session; 12 credits per term
- ✓ *Korean Society & Culture* (or similar) recommended
- ✓ Internship (optional; Summer Session only)
- ✓ Lecture series in China & Japan (Summer Term only)

WINTER SESSION

- ✓ Maximum of 5 credits per session

Contemporary Korean Studies and *Korean Society & Culture* serve as the regional studies courses, which familiarize students with South Korea and facilitate cultural integration.

INTERNSHIPS

Internships allow students to learn from practical experience not attainable in a classroom setting. Placement is available in business, finance, marketing, engineering, IT, creative media, and other professional tracks. **During the semester**, internships are 20 to 25 hours per week (6-9 credits). Students may also enroll in 1 to 3 courses. **During the summer session**, internships are 30 or more hours per week (3 credits). Students may enroll in 1 online course.
