Brief Overview

This paper prepares a base for a proper entry into film theory—but at this point only some theoretical approaches are lightly touched upon. The course will take students through the medium of cinema, a glimpse into pre-cinema with special emphasis on India (phad and pat, chitrakathi and puppetry), a history of technology leading to cinema, a brief political and economical history of the nineteenth and the twentieth century and the film movements emerging out of them, etc. The paper will lay emphasis on Silent Cinema from Europe, America and India, and the two film theories emerging out of them.

- Develop a philosophical base of the arts as relevant to cinema.
