

ACCF SASF 110 SKETCHING FLORENCE

Course	Sketching Florence

Semester	Fall / spring

Sketching Florence is a freehand drawing course, designed for both beginners and advanced students.		
The course is divided into two modules.		
In the first module students will draw on-site different Florentine monuments, landscapes and architecture, some of these well-known others less but equally beautiful or interesting. The lessons time will also be dedicated to some drawing exercises in class. The learning process will be completed with the homework.		
The main objective of this module is to help students acquire and/or deepen their drawing skills while they gain a deeper knowledge of the Florentine environment.		
 The second module will be dedicated to a final project: the students are asked to think of what they have seen of Florence so far in order to develop a personal series of six drawings. The interpretation each student will give to the theme will be defined at the end of the first module. 		
The main objective of this module is to develop the students' drawing techniques together with their knowledge of the city of Florence in a main work.		
In this course, students will:		
 Acquire the basic skills of life drawing Experiment with various graphic techniques Refine acquired skills and knowledge and develop an autonomous pathway of research 		
 Develop a capacity for expressive communication through drawing Develop a capacity to refine and present their work well 		
Students will be assessed based on their:		
 Skills improvement from a starting level Homework (quality of the drawings, punctuality on consignment) Class work (quality of the drawings, active participation in class) Final project (quality of the drawings)
