Course Description	This course is intended to provide the student disciplinary tools necessary to address the design process with the aim of producing a collection of high-quality clothing or costumes for a particular event such as a stage, awards, film, dance or opera production, from concept to development of the garments, paying particular attention to detail and tailoring methods.
	Project:
	Each student will produce at least two garments or two outfits taking part of a project within the theme, proceeding in accordance with the logical sequence to produce a garment (inspirational theme, choice of color & fabric, colored drawings, technical drawings, technical sheet, pattern, prototype, final and complete garment), paying particular attention on the choice of tailored details.
	At the end of the course the student will have learned to: • Develop a quality mood board that demonstrates research on the event related to

	 Apply acquired sewing skills in the creation of tailored garments using the requested finishing techniques correctly.
	 Organize the necessary resources for the creation of high-quality garments in a timely manner.
