COURSE SYLLABUS CREDIT: 4 UNITS

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This is a senior course meant to enlighten the students on the various aspects of collective behaviour in diverse contexts as a special sociological phenomena. It encompasses issues such as: The nature of collective behavior specifically crowds, masses and mass communication, inter alia, together with social movements and methodologies and theories appropriate to the study of collective behaviour, both quantitative and field approaches. The implication of collective behaviour with respect to societal change and development will be covered.

- (a) Understand the various concepts and definitions used in the study of collective behavior.
- (b) Elucidate the various types and causes of collective behaviour and their implication to societal change, stability and development.
- (c) Understand the social dynamics of collective behavior.

- (e) Understand Mass publics communication and public opinion as an aspect of collective behavior.
- (f) Appreciate and develop a critical mind with regard to collective behavior.
