





Spanish Language Advanced II (B2.1)

Level: Advanced I (B2.1)*

ACTFL Levels: Advanced Mid (reading and listening); Advanced Low (speaking and writing)

Institution: EDE Escuela de Español Academic Credit: 6 Semester Credits**

* This course is taught intensively (10 to 12 hours per week) and consists of lectures, discussions and practicums. The course advances through multiple levels by the end of the semester.

OVERVIEW

This course pays special attention to graduation and sequence of content, combining linguistic (lexical and grammatical) and pragmatic skills in each unit. The student will be an active element of the teaching and learning process where he/she feels empowered to complete course requirements.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

Students, upon completion of the program, should reach the following learning outcomes:

- 1. Use the language as a means of communication and personal expression in multiple situations.
- 2. Understand a great variety of readings.
- 3. Talk about a wide variety of topics. The student's ability to react adequately with a higher degree of accuracy (compared to previous levels).
- 4. Improve knowledge of the socio-cultural aspects related to everyday situations.
- 5. To promote and diversify the use of communication strategies to expedite and facilitate learning.
- 6. Elaborate clear and well-structured texts.

METHODOLOGY

The aim of the classes is both linguistic and cultural learning. Structured grammar, exercises, games, reading texts, role play, and study teamwork are the main components of our classes.

Learning in the Classroom

In addition, the center will provide:

- Supplementary materials in class: activities, games, readings, etc.
- Use of the audiovisual material from the center to work with interactive resources, film, music, presentations, etc.

Immersion and practice

Students participate in practicums, which are intended to facilitate linguistic immersion through practical use of the language. Practicums include one or more of the following:

- Visits to cultural sites with guides in Spanish and/or assignments (papers, projects, presentations, etc.) associated with each visit
- Conversations with native speakers on predetermined topics and/or topics of interest to students (business, politics, art, music, culture, etc.).
- Visits to local business such as cafes to practice Spanish language in a natural setting.

Additional support

Students who need additional support will be required to attend the Grammar Tutorial (1 hour per week).

EVALUATION

Student progression in the different language skills (reading comprehension, listening comprehension, writing, oral expression, interaction and mediation) is measured by:

- Tests and exams 70%, (50% Written, 20% Oral)
- Performing Tasks 20%
- Class participation 10%

In addition, students who complete the number of hours and sufficiently pass academic content and objectives for the B2.1 level, have the opportunity to take an assessment test which certifies that eligible to reach the next level (C1). The Cervantes Official Exam is proctored by Universidad de Burgos and costs between 90 and 180 euro. If a student is interested in participating in this exam, please inform your instructor who will provide the relevant information.
