

Section 2 Aims and Objectives

1. Course Goals

To introduce aspects of applying psychological facts and principles to the problems concerning human beings operating within context of business and industry.

To encourage students to reflect upon the theoretical framework of a study that analyzes the impact that individuals, groups and structure have on behaviour within organization.

To discuss how to apply such knowledge towards improving human outputs such as productivity, work satisfaction, citizenship as well as lowering absenteeism and job turnover.

2. Objectives of Course Development/Revision

2.1 Course Objectives

This course aims to provide knowledge and abilities as follows:

To provide students with an introduction to industrial and organizational psychology. Students shall develop an understanding of scientific methods and analysis to be able to more profoundly discuss various concepts and theories related to industrial and organizational psychology. They will learn how to work collaboratively in classroom settings dealing with different student backgrounds and personalities and to communicate effectively. Students shall learn how to apply theories to situations at work as to increase a healthy lifestyle and to contribute to social harmony in the society.
